



Sports Premium Funding – Expenditure Academic Year 2015-2016

SpringFit Gymnastics

- During the Spring term, SpringFit have come in to deliver gymnastics lessons with the support of the class teacher.
- Year 5 and 6 have benefitted from SpringFit training in the second half of the Spring Term.
Cost: £800

Street Dance – Cass Hounslow

- Cass Hounslow (The Jam Academy) worked with Year 4 during the second half of the Spring Term with x5 street dance lessons.
Cost: £300

Cricket Coaching – Neil Bunting

- Neil Bunting worked with all year groups to deliver Quik Cricket coaching with the support of the class teachers.
- Neil also coached the Year 6 boys Quik Cricket team ahead of the local tournament.

Tag Rugby Support – Josh Evans

- Josh Evans worked with all year groups to deliver Tag Rugby coaching with the support of the class teachers.

PE Leader Cover

- A new PE coordinator has been appointed who will take on the Netball Team, Football B team and Change 4 Life clubs as well as all of the admin for sporting events. She will also be the leader at all sporting events that the school attends.
Cost: £3100

Storage for PE Equipment

- Storage for the PE equipment on the top field and playground.
Cost Approx: £500

Average percentages across the whole school – 80% of the children took part in a sporting extra-curricular activity and 60% of the children represented the school in an inter-school competition.

Analysis: Autumn 2015 – Summer 2016

Participation

- In Years 4, 5 and 6, at least 60% of the children have participated in a sports club this academic year, which means that we have achieved our participation target for these cohorts.
- In Year 3, over 80% percent of the boys have joined a sports club, whilst only 52% of the girls have this academic year.
- Years 4 and 6 have outstanding participation statistics, with over 90% of the children taking part in a sports club.
- Children who qualify for Pupil Premium or have English as an additional language in Year 5 participated less in sporting extra-curricular activities than the other children in Year 5 and other PP/EAL children across the school.

Representation

- The representation target of 50% has been achieved in Year 4, 5 and 6 and the percentages have been similar for both genders.
- In Year 3, 61% of the girls have represented the school which has exceeded the 50% target.
- An imbalance of the number of girls and boys in Year 3 has meant that there have been fewer opportunities for the boys to represent the school, accounting for the lower percentage.
- There are fewer opportunities for the Year 3 children to take part in inter school competitions which accounts for their lower representation percentage.
- Children with SEND or those that have English as an additional language in Year 3 were less likely to represent the school than the other children in Year 3 and other SEND/EAL children across the school.
- Children who qualify for Pupil Premium or have English as an additional language in Year 4 were less likely to represent the school than the other children in Year 4.

General Findings

- In general, the statistics do not show that either gender participates in extra-curricular sporting activities or represents the school in inter-school competitions more than the other.

- Furthermore, there are not any significant trends across the school relating to participation in extra-curricular activities or representing the school in inter school competitions for children with SEND/EAL or those who qualify for Pupil Premium funding.

What do we need to do to improve?

- Year 3 girls are currently not taking as much of an active role in the sporting extra-curricular activities that the school offers. As a variety of free and fee paying sports activities have been offered before school, at lunch and after school this year, we must continue to promote them to ensure that all children that show an interest have the opportunity to take part. The Year 6 Sports Crew will support the teachers in this.
